Professor (W3) of Biological Psychology and Cognitive Neuroscience

The Faculty of Psychology and Sport Science of Bielefeld University stands for a pronounced research orientation and a committed teaching style. The Department of Psychology covers all areas of the field and unites natural science and social science research traditions. In terms of teaching, the currently existing program MSc Psychology will soon be replaced by three specialized MSc programs in Clinical Psychology and Psychotherapy; Assessment, Counseling, and Coaching as well as Experimental Psychology and Neuroscience. Sharpening of the research profile as well as extending existing and establishing novel faculty internal and faculty transcending research collaborations is a key goal of the Department.

The holder of the professorship should cover both fields - Biological Psychology and Cognitive Neuroscience - in research and teaching. Her or his profile in these two areas should be documented by internationally visible empirical research with experimental biopsychological and neuroscientific methods (e.g. fMRI, neuroendocrinology, EEG) and by third-party funding. It is expected that the position holder will actively participate in at least of one two interdisciplinary university-wide research fields, namely "Life Perspectives - Opportunities and Adversities (Life Chances)" and/or "Intelligent Interactive Systems (IIS)". Connectivity to the Collaborative Research Centre (SFB) initiative with the topic of social devaluation as well as to the research focus "brain, participation, and disability" of the new medical faculty is advantageous. Teaching refers to the B.Sc. program in Psychology and the to be established M.Sc. program in Experimental Psychology and Neuroscience.

Recruitment requirements for the advertised professorship are a university degree and a doctoral degree in a relevant field as well as additional scientific achievements.

Applicants for whom German is not a first language should be able to teach courses in German, in addition to courses in English, within about two years of hiring.

Applications from suitably qualified handicapped and severely handicapped persons are explicitly encouraged.

Bielefeld University has received a number of awards for its achievements as an equal-opportunity employer and has been recognized as a family-friendly university. The university welcomes applications from women.
